
Cat and Dog Theology: The Top Five Life Lessons Most Homeschool Families Miss

If our kids know all of the 3 R's, but don't live for God's glory, we've done a tremendous injustice to them.

- 1. Idolatry Still Exists In The Homeschool Environment
 - a. The perfect child
 - b. The perfect outward form
 - c. The perfect relationships
 - d. The perfect future
 - e. The perfect control.
 - i. In all of this, we've left out the grace of Jesus.
- 2. Heaven is Cool
 - a. Philippians 1:21: For me to live is Christ, and to die is second best, but at least you're not going to hell. Look on the bright side!
 - i. Heaven is a step down from earth.
 - ii. Therefore we cling to these 80 or so years God gives us.
 - b. Satan wants to ruin heaven's reputation. (Revelation 13:6)
 - c. If heaven is seen as boring, unimaginable and an unearthly existence, why should we share the good news that people can go there?
 - d. Colossians 3:1: We are to do a diligent, active, single-minded investigation of heaven.
 - e. What God has revealed about heaven:
 - i. Rev. 21:1 The present heaven is not the real heaven.
 - ii. Revelation 6:9-11
 - 1. Will will be emotional and can raise our voices
 - 2. We will be aware of each other and the situation on earth.
 - 3. We can ask God questions.
 - 4. There is learning in heaven.
 - 5. We will have concerns for justice.
 - 6. There is time in heaven.
 - 7. We will have a strong connection with those on earth.
 - 8. God knows to the last details what is still happening on earth.
 - iii. Hebrews 11:10; Heaven will have buildings, roads, culture, art, justice, theaters, athletics, goods and services.
 - iv. There will be authority in heaven. Romans 2:26, 3:21
 - v. Hebrews 1:1,2, Rom 8:16,17: We will rule of the universe with Jesus.
- 3. You don't earn your salvation, but you do earn your rewards.
 - a. Catholics vs. Protestants
 - i. Most Catholics are "works oriented" and have scripture to back it up.
 - ii. Most Protestants are "faith oriented" and have scripture to back it up.
 - b. There is a difference between "entering" the kingdom of God and "inheriting" the kingdom of God.
 - i. Entering (heaven) is present tense and faith is required.
 - ii. Inheriting (our rewards) requires works and character
 - c. 1 Peter 1:3,4; Our inheritance can't be heaven, because it is kept IN heaven for us.
 - d. Col 3:23,24; Our works for the Lord give us an "inheritance."

- e. All Christians will appear before Christ and have our lives judged. (2 Cor 5:10)
- f. The judgment will result in eternal differences:
 - i. Our Bodies:
 - 1. Some of us will shine like the sun.
 - 2. Some of us will shine like the moon.
 - 3. Some of us will shine like stars.
 - ii. Ruling
 - 1. Some of us will rule over 10 cities.
 - 2. Some of us will rule over 5 cities.
 - 3. Some of us will be there and won't rule over any cities.
- g. Mat 5:19; Some will be least in the kingdom, some will be great in the kingdom.
- h. Bruce Wilkinson:
 - i. What you **believe** determines **where** you will spend eternity. What you **do** determines **how** you will spend eternity.
- i. 1 Cor 3:12-15
 - i. Some people are going to have to forfeit their kingdom because they wasted their lives.
- 4. There's a Story in the Bible
 - a. God made a promise to Abraham in Genesis 12 to bless him and for him to be a blessing to all nations.
 - b. God fulfills that promise in Revelation 5:9. Everything in between is "One Story."
 - c. Christ won't come back until all nations are reached.



5. Life is not about Us

- a. If the church were like a selfish bride, we could come to God, not for who He is, but for what He could give us.
- b. Jesus died PRIMARILY to glorify His Father, secondarily for our sins.
- c. The joke:
 - i. A Dog says, "You pet me, you feed me, you shelter me, you love me, you must be God."





- ii. A Cat says, You pet me, you feed me, you shelter me, you love me, I must be God."
- d. Here's how a Cat thinks:
 - i. Jesus left the Father's glory **for me**, He suffered **for me**, He died **for me**, He's gone back to heaven to build a mansion **for me**, He's up there interceding **for me**, and He's coming back a second time **for me**. Gee, I wonder who He lives for? He must live **for me**!
 - ii. Ephesians 5:1 says be an imitator of God, therefore I'll be like God and live for me too. I'll just do it in a Christian context. I won't do any of the bad things. I'll go to church, and help teach Sunday school. I'll do all of the right things. But I'll do it all **for me**!
- e. Here's how a Dog Things.
 - i. Jesus did everything to glorify the Father. Therefore I should live to glorify the Father.
- f. The Extreme Differences Between Cats and Dogs
 - i. Cats think: Since Jesus suffered for me, I'm not going to have to suffer any more.
 - ii. Dogs think: Since Jesus suffered to glorify His Father, He's left me an example, *I should be willing to suffer to glorify His Father as well*.
- g. Cats are basically living for themselves in a Christian context. They want God's blessings more than they want God Himself.


- 1. Heaven Is Cool:

 - b. Our 2nd Elementary Curriculum in 2017.






